Call It What It Is will be the band's first new album in eight years. Australian audiences will be among the first to hear new songs from the album, along with classics such as 'Burn To Shine', 'Steal My Kisses' and 'Diamonds In The Inside'.

Tracing their roots back to 1993, the Innocent Criminals (percussionist Leon Mobley, bassist Juan Nelson, drummer Oliver Charles, keyboardist Jason Yates and guitarist Michael Ward) were involved in many Ben Harper projects before going on hiatus in 2008. The band toured nonstop, earning legions of fans thanks to

explosive live performances and a succession of acclaimed studio albums including *Fight For Your Mind*, *The Will to Live*, *Burn to Shine*, *Diamonds on the Inside* and the GRAMMY® nominated *Lifeline*, their last studio album together in 2007. The Innocent Criminals also backed Ben and The Blind Boys of Alabama on the two-time GRAMMY® winning collaborative album *There Will Be A Light* in 2004.
