Brabham Grandstand

Situated on the infield of Turn-1, the Brabham Grandstand remains one of Albert Park's most sought-after positions on the circuit.

Seats in the Brabham Grandstand put you in a prime position to watch as drivers jostle for a position through the first corners of Sunday's race, a section of the circuit that has been the site of so many iconic Australian F1® Grand Prix moments.

Located just a short walk from Melbourne Walk, M-Lane (home of our Sessions Stage) and with super-screens, food, and beverage nearby, you won't miss a moment of the action.







Button Grandstand

Named after Jenson Button, 2009 World Champion and two-time winner of the Australian Grand Prix, the Button Grandstand replaces The Balconies Grandstand in 2023.

Located on the outfield of Turn-8 and just a short walk from Gate 5, the Button Grandstand puts you on top of the action as cars navigate the long right-hander before sling-shotting themselves down one of the fastest straights on the calendar.

With views of a super-screen and food and beverage in the garden area in front of the grandstand, you're never far from the action.







Clark Grandstand

Located on the outfield, just past Turn-8 and accessible via Gate 5, the Clark Grandstand puts you in position to see the cars exit hurtle towards top-speed down Albert Park's newest high-speed straight.

Nearby super-screens mean you won't miss a moment on the on-track action, with nearby amenities meaning food and drink is never far away.

The Clark Grandstand is also just a short walk from our main pedestrian footbridge across the lake, putting you at the cultural centre of the Grand Prix right by M-Lane, the home of our Sessions Stage.







Fangio Grandstand

It's the moment that defines every Grand Prix, the eery silence falls across the racetrack in anticipation of lights out, and you'll have one of the best seats in the house from the Fangio Grandstand.

Overlooking the Main Straight and seated across from the Pit Buildings, the Fangio Grandstand is the place to see it all, from lights out to the waving of the chequered flag and podium celebrations.

The Fangio Grandstand is best accessed from Gate 1 and backs onto one of Albert Park's key activation zones with plenty to see and do and no shortage of food and drink options close by.







Hill Grandstand

Renamed in 2023 after the inaugural winner of the Australian F1® Grand Prix in Melbourne (Damon Hill), the Hill Grandstand is located on the outfield of Turn-3, an overtaking hot spot on the revamped Albert Park Grand Prix Circuit.

Just a short distance from Gate 3, the Hill Grandstand offers views over Turn 3 and the short chute towards Turn 4.

With super-screen views and an exclusive hang-out area that includes food trucks and bars, you won't miss a moment of the action as Australia's biggest live racing and entertainment returns to Melbourne.

Jones Grandstand

Situated on the outfield of Turn-1 and just a short walk from Gate 1, the Jones Grandstand remains one of Albert Park's most sought-after positions on the circuit.

Seats in the Jones Grandstand put you in a position to watch as drivers jostle for a position through those initial key corners of Sunday's race, a section of the circuit that has been the site of countless iconic Australian F1® Grand Prix moments.

Cars will be pushed to their limits as they enter Turn-1, the heavy braking zone at the end of the Main Straight providing one of the circuit's key overtaking opportunities and with a super-screen, food and bar facilities nearby, you'll never be far from the action.







Lauda Grandstand

With views back towards the city and unrivalled viewing angles for any overtakes coming out of Turn-11, the Lauda Grandstand puts fans on the driver's left of Turn-12, a critical sweeping right-hander as the cars hurtle towards Albert Park's final corners.

The Lauda Grandstand is most easily accessed via Gate 10, with food and drink conveniently located nearby.







Moss Grandstand

Situated on the outfield of the Main Straight just before Turn-1, the Moss Grandstand will see cars pushed to their limit as they reach top speed through the DRS Zone, with slipstreaming passing opportunities as they enter the heavy breaking zone ahead of Turn-1.

Just a short walk from Gate 1, the Moss Grandstand has wheelchair-accessible seating available, provides super-screen viewing and has a range of food and beverage options conveniently located nearby.







Prost Grandstand

Looking down on the apex of Turn-14, the Prost Grandstand not only gives fans views of Albert Park's penultimate corner but is ideally situated across from Pit Entry.

You'll see cars pushed to their absolute limits, exiting Turn-14 before roaring down the circuit's main straight and with a super-screen situated across from your seat, you'll be able to live the action from start to finish.

The Prost Grandstand is also just a short walk from one of Albert Park's key activation zones, with plenty to see and do with no shortage of food and drink available nearby.







Ricciardo Grandstand

Back in its 2022 location due to popular demand, with the addition of premium undercover seating options, the Ricciardo Grandstand is situated on the infield between Turns 3 & 4, with views over one of the most technically challenging sections of the Albert Park Circuit.

With the widened Turn-3 set to be one of the circuit's key overtaking opportunities once again, seats in the Ricciardo Grandstand are once again set to be some of the most in-demand tickets of the 2023 race.

Best accessed via Gate 2, the Ricciardo Grandstand provides super-screen viewing and is only a short walk from M-Lane, the cultural centre of the Australian Grand Prix and the home of our Sessions Stage.







Schumacher Grandstand

Located between Albert Park's final two corners, the Schumacher Grandstand provides some of the best views of Turn-13, a corner that saw Valtteri Bottas able to find a gap and move past Pierre Gasly in the 2022 race after it was widened by 3.5m to make it more difficult for lead cars to defend their position.

With the entry to Pit Lane directly across from you and a super-screen broadcasting all the action live, you'll be able to live the action from all around the track without having to leave your seat.

The Schumacher Grandstand has wheelchair seating available and is conveniently located only a short distance from Legends Lane, one of Albert Park's key activation zones with plenty to see and do with no shortage of food and drink options available.







Senna Grandstand

Carrying the name of a legend, and with premium undercover seating available, the Senna Grandstand gives fans views from the top of Main Straight, watching as the cars use every inch of the racetrack on the exit Turn-14, enabling DRS and roaring towards top-speed down the Main Straight.

The Senna Grandstand not only puts you at the centre of the on-track action but backs onto one of Albert Park's marquee activation zones, putting you at the heart of the off-track action as well.

With no shortage of food and drink options nearby, you'll barely need to leave your seat to be able to enjoy the best of a Grand Prix weekend at Albert Park.







Stewart Grandstand

Re-located to an all-new position for 2023, the Stewart Grandstand is now located on the exit of Turn-5, the site of the epic shunt between Lance Stroll and Nicholas Latifi in 2022's first qualifying session.

Best accessed from Gate 3, the Stewart Grandstand will have super-screen viewing to make sure you don't miss a moment of the action on track.







Vettel Grandstand

Named after the retiring Sebastian Vettel, a four-time World Champion and four-time winner at Albert Park, the Vettel Grandstand gives fans views across Turn-11, the site of Fernando Alonso's accident during Q3 in 2022.

The Vettel Grandstand includes super-screen viewing, keeping fans connected to the action right around the circuit, with food and beverage amenities in an exclusive garden area for the grandstand.

Easily accessed from Gate 9 (one of the most convenient gates when travelling by public transport), access to the rest of the circuit from the Vettel Grandstand requires you to utilise one of the circuit's footbridges to cross over onto the infield.







Webber Grandstand

The Webber Grandstand, named after an Australian motorsport legend, returns to its 2022 home on the infield of Turn-11.

Fans in the Webber Grandstand had the best seats in the house in 2022 when Fernando Alonso's Q3 came to an abrupt end and expect there to be plenty of action at the corner once again in 2023, with multiple racing lines and a tighter apex likely to create opportunities for aggressive drivers into Turn-11.

With super-screen viewing to keep you connected to all the on-track action and an array of food and beverage close by, it doesn't get much better than Webber.
